WALKING & BIKING


With so many people walking and bike riding here are some good things to remember:

WALKING

If you are on a road either with or without a shoulder you should always walk against traffic ... that is, vehicles should be driving toward you. According to the National Center for Safe Routes to School www. saferoutesinfo.org, the reason is this: "(walking against presents traffic) opportunities to establish eye contact with approaching motorists and make quick judgments to protect oneself." Plus, in the evening it would be great if the walkers wore light or reflective clothing and carried some sort of light.

BIKING

When you are on a bicycle, think of yourself as another vehicle on the road. So, if you are another vehicle, you should be biking WITH traffic. Don't make up traffic rules as you bike along because erratic biking behavior puts you at risk for crashes (studies have shown that a risk of a crash increases FIVE TIMES when you ride without regard for rules of traffic). Your goal is blend in with the traffic and help it flow easily. While there may be a fear that you'll be hit from behind by oncoming traffic, the reality is that rear-end collisions between vehicles and bicycles are rare; the most frequent cause of car-bike crashes are from bicyclists riding on the left side of the road. So, remember: Ride on the right.





Instructions for use are as follows:

- **1.** Open the grill cover.
- **2.** Turn on the timer which is the black knob located on the back post. You will see a 1, 2, or 3, those are the hours. So, if you turn it to one the gas will stay on for 1 hour and then turn itself off.
- **3.** There are (2) burners light them one at a time by turning the knob to light and pressing the Ignitor button or the right. You will hear a "whoosh" sound when it lights.
- **4.** Once you have finished grilling turn the two knobs to the off position. You do not need to turn off the timer it will go off on its own.
- **5.** Clean the grill and close the cover.



A NOTE FROM YOUR **VICE PRESIDENT**


To all our friends and neighbors at Las Palmas:
